## Help Me Learn about God in My Own Language

Sa-wat-dee. That's "hello" in the Thai language.

How would you feel if your teacher was speaking in a different language and no one told you what the words meant? What if your teacher said to you, "I have a very important message for you: Prah Yesu rak than"? Would you understand what your teacher said? How would you learn if you couldn't understand a single word? Teachers in other countries need Sunday School lessons in their own language so they can teach their students about God from God's Word, the Bible.

"Prah Yesu rak than" means "Jesus loves you" in Thai. Kids throughout Asia need to learn about God in their own language. With Operation Translation, you can help them get Sunday School lessons they can understand! Gospel Literature Services (GLS) has volunteers ready to translate RBP Sunday School lessons from English into Thai, Korean, or Burmese.

Thailand has 15 million school-age children. Many of them could learn about Jesus if churches had Sunday School lessons in their own language. In Thailand two ladies, Grace and Pet, are working very hard to translate Sunday School materials into the Thai language. But it will take a lot of money to print those Sunday School books and student papers. Your missions offering can make that happen! In South Korea, two other ladies are translating Sunday School lessons into the Korean language. Ten million children live in South Korea. Will you help them too?
